

Gender differences in adolescent personality and stressors of the situation

Abstract

The aim of the present study was to investigate the gender differences in personality and stressors of the situation. The participants of the study were 60 adolescents (30 boys & 30 girls) studying in S.S.C board in a school in Mumbai. The tools used were HSPQ (High school personality questionnaire) to measure personality and Riverside situational Q-sort version 3.15 to measure stressors of the situation. The obtained results indicate no significant difference in the stressors of the situation in boys and girls and significant difference on the personality factors A, C, E, H, I, J and Q2 in boys and girls.
